





FISHING AND HUNTING PRACTICES

Give 3 major differences between hunting practices 50 years ago and today

- The way of life:

 Transition from nomadic lifestyle to life in settlements.
- Transportation mode :
 Snowmobiles and motor boats replaced kayaks and dog sleds.
- Weapons:

 Guns replaced most of the traditional
 weapons (harpoons, spears, etc.)

How is hunting and fishing knowledge transferred in Inuit communities?

Hunting and fishing knowledge is passed on by elders and family members. Younger generations learn by watching and repeating gestures.




